
FY 2024 Annual Report Summary

DIRECT EDUCATION

From October 2023 through September 2024 (FY 2024), nutrition educators taught SNAP-Ed community-based nutrition classes in every county. SNAP-Ed delivers nutrition education through collaboration with community partners who serve those who are SNAP eligible. Classes include hands-on activities focusing on MyPlate, choosing healthier beverages, developing food safety skills, stretching food dollars, and being more active every day.


We serve youth, single adults, and seniors. In FY2024, 454 participants enrolled in the program.

• Adult participants identified as 43% Asian, 23% Mixed Race, 19% Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, 12% White, 2% Black, 2% American Indian or Alaskan Native, and 2% unreported.



Adult participants showed improvement in one or more indicators related to diet quality (91%), food resource management (83%), physical activity (54%), food safety (63%), and food security (40%).

Youth participants showed improvement in all indicators measured. Indicators related to diet quality (93%), food resource management (62%), food safety (80%), and physical activity (68%).

FY 24 PSE Activities

234 activities were conducted across all counties in Hawai'i.

Hawai'i SNAP-Ed PSE activities include: Food to Grow, Got EBT?, and Farm to School. Activities worked to:

- Distribute vegetable seedlings and other materials to families for home gardening
- Promote fresh and local produce
- Implement innovative methods to get produce to the community
- Increase acceptance and use of SNAP/EBT/WIC
- Maintain edible school gardens
